Tuesday 5th February

Grow your own -

School Vegetable Garden

Suitable for: EYFS, KS1 & KS2

Learn how to create a productive school vegetable garden - Discover what to plant to ensure you have a crop ready in term time and explore strategies for maintaining the garden throughout the year.

Monday 25th February

Inspiring Literacy Outdoors

Suitable for: KS2

Discover how to maximise your outdoor space to develop KS2 literacy skills and support work done in class. Alongside exploring your own creativity using classic texts we will also develop cross-curricular topic activities to use in the outdoor space at your school.

Tuesday 5th March

The Language of Nature

Suitable for: EYFS & KS1

A hands-on outdoor day for EYFS and KS1 focusing on the developments of language and literacy skills through creative, multisensory, nature-based activities. The day will include games, crafts, stories and imaginative exercises which engage learners with the outdoor setting.

Tuesday 12th March

Muddy Maths

Suitable for: EYFS & KS1

Investigate different uses for natural materials and ways to use simple equipment in delivering maths games and activities in the outdoor world. Come along and get ideas for using back at school in wooded areas, on the playing fields and the playground itself.

Wednesday 13th March

Creature Comforts

Suitable for: EYFS, KS1 & KS2

Children need nature (& nature needs children). Discover some simple ways to optimise the habitats available to you, however limited. We'll look for mini beasts, survey the field and try pond-dipping. Explore simple activities to attract nature and create habitats. You'll plan what changes you might make & we'll discuss available resources.

Monday 18th March

Developing your Outdoor Space for Learning

Suitable for: EYFS, KS1 & KS2

Whether you only have a playground or are overwhelmed with your outdoor area, learn tips and ideas to make the most of what you have. See how you can minimise planning and preparation with a few simple tricks. The focus will be a broad based approach to curriculum learning including STEM activities plus Geography, History and English. We will also look at how to set up simple growing spaces that are effective and easy to manage.

Tuesday 26th March

Navigating your way around Maps & Compasses

Suitable for: KS2

Discover exciting new skills to teach your class this practical element of the national curriculum in the outdoors. You will cover where direction comes from; navigation activities using a compass; exploring the world of symbols and signs; reading maps and creating sketch maps. Finishing with how you can bring this learning to life using orienteering at school.

Wednesday 27th March

Mindfulness in Nature

Suitable for: EYFS, KS1 & KS2

Learn how to use our natural world as a tool for teaching mindfulness. Find out how to use the outdoors and what nature provides us with in all seasons and in all weathers to enable children to be happy, calm and confident inside and out.

Wednesday 27th March

Introduction to Forest School

Suitable for: KS1 & KS2

Learn about the Forest School approach to learning and gain some practical, adaptable ideas by spending a day in a woodland setting with a Forest School Association endorsed trainer.

Tuesday 2nd April

Forest School Fun : A Taster Session

Suitable for: EYFS, KS1 & KS2

This course introduces the concept and principles of Forest School. Explore the learning opportunities and experience taster activities such as den-building, using ropes and building a campfire. It is an ideal introduction to those considering undertaking formal forest school training.

Wednesday 3rd April

The John Muir Award in Schools

Suitable for: Upper KS2 & above

The John Muir Award is an environmental award scheme focused on wild places. Learn how to use the framework of this nationally recognised award to celebrate the achievements of your learners in the outdoors. It supports people to connect with, enjoy and care for nature, landscape, and the natural environment. It's non-competitive, inclusive, accessible and is free to use.
